The Executive Fellows program celebrated its 10th year and welcomed 24 new fellows who are now participating in redesigned online sessions, including new topics such as Best IT Practices for Remote Teams.

building for 16 civil justice nonprofits in the areas of research and evaluation, pro bono program management, and innovation leadership.

OneJustice staff met with 33 of the 55 California delegates to Congress and provided educational materials to the remaining 22 California delegates, explaining the importance of civil legal aid in each Member's district. Californians for Legal Aid also helped secure an increase of \$25 million in federal funding to the Legal Services Corporation.

OneJustice ended FY 1819 with a slight surplus. The gap between revenue and spending reflects a decision to accept and release over several years significant, non-renewable grants as a strategic, temporary expansion of services between FY 1718 and FY 1920.
